When Paul Zimmerman began visiting 'colored' schools in 1946 little did he dream of what the future would hold. In 2002 a new camp cabin design was approved. The last cabin was ready to use in 2018. What a contrast to the original ones! Cedar and Pine villages each have 5 double modern cabins with an all-purpose room built in the lower floor of one of the cabins in each village.

Since 1974 one of the first buildings seen when entering Cedine was the fire hall. That building, that once housed our fire engines, now is the Fire House, consisting of an apartment and two motel style rooms.

Both the camp chapel and all the rooms where our conference guests stay now have A/C. What a change 75 years make! We have gone from used army surplus tents to rustic cabins to airconditioned motel type rooms!

Sunday, March 29, 2020 was a day of destruction and changed the landscape of Cedine forever. Although the high tornado-like winds did much damage, we are thankful no lives were injured or lost.

Still in the midst of a covid pandemic we continue to seek Him for new ways to serve and minister for Him at Cedine.

We praise Him for His faithfulness as seen in the lives of literally thousands of young people and adults who have come our way during these past 75 years! Yes, it is easy to see the seeds in an apple, but harder to see the apple in a seed. Cedine Ministries began in unchartered territory. It was a new venture but God was in it. Paul Zimmerman had a vision, and planted a seed. Pray that seed will continue to produce fruit until the Lord comes to call all His chosen ones Home.

Jane White has been volunteering at Cedine for over 25 years. She works in the mailing department where she addresses the bulk mailings. If you receive one of the thousands of reports, or hundreds of devotional guides or staff letters, more than likely Jane has processed them. This involves interfacing with the United States Postal Service and with our software provider making sure that our processes are accurate and up to date.

Jane was born and raised in Grandview, TN. She graduated from Spring City High School. After high school, she moved to Atlanta and worked at an oil company for six years. In 1975 after a divorce, she and her young son moved back to Spring City. She got a job with the Tennessee Valley Authority, took some college courses, completed an engineering aide training course, and enjoyed her 21 years there. Due to a reduction in force (RIF) at TVA, she was presented with the opportunity to take early retirement. This early retirement, along with the support of her husband, made it possible for her to work at Cedine for a couple of days a week (more or less as the job requires).

As a young girl, Jane attended Sunday school and Youth Group. There was not a doubt in her mind that Jesus died on the cross to save people from their sins. She had heard about Jesus all her life, but she didn't know Him. Her life was a mess, but she didn't really know it. Sometimes "you don't know what you don't know". Someone asked her if growing up without a father had affected her life in any way, and she responded "Nah, not at all." But the reality was that she was going into a more sinful lifestyle, looking for that which was missing in her life. This verse described her life, "For My people have

committed two evils: They have forsaken Me, the fountain of living waters, and hewn themselves cisterns—broken cisterns that can hold no water." (Jeremiah 2:13)

However, when she was in her early thirties, sad and broken, the Lord opened her eyes to her sinfulness, and she cried



out to the Lord, "O Lord, how could you die for me? I am such a sinner!" She trusted in Christ alone that day, believing that He died for her even when she was His enemy. He was her Savior! That day she "turned to God from idols (herself) to serve the living and true God" (1 Thessalonians 1:9). Has she reached perfection yet? No, life is still a struggle at times, sin is still present, the flesh is weak, but she knows in Whom she has believed, and is confident "of this very thing, that He who has begun a good work in you (Jane) will complete it until the day of Jesus Christ" (Philippians 1:6).

The Lord has given her the gifts of "helps" and "giving", and she enjoys work! When she isn't working at Cedine, she is working in her home, yard, and church. Her husband calls her the "energizer bunny." She loves spending time with her family: husband (Jeff), son (Matt), daughter-in-law (Michelle), granddaughters (Emilee and Ellee).
